Instructions to Municipal, County, or Sheriff Designee

This form is only used for vehicles that were seized by law enforcement but not disposed of through the courts and the vehicles have since been unclaimed in accordance with Code of Criminal Procedure, Article 18.17. This process must be properly completed by the municipal designee, which includes an officer or employee of the municipality, a county purchasing agent, or the county sheriff if the county does not have a county purchasing agent. A law enforcement agency may be a municipal designee.

- Original, handwritten signatures are required.
- If available, to ensure value limiting remarks are recorded on all subsequent certificates of title for this vehicle, you must note any remarks shown on the Texas or out-of-state title or registration verification in the area provided on page 1. Examples of remarks include "Salvage," "Rebuilt Salvage," "Reconditioned," etc.
- If the vehicle's title and registration verification does not indicate the vehicle is salvage, nonrepairable, or flood damaged, but is in such a condition, mark "Yes" in the applicable boxes.
 - o If flood damaged, the vehicle is considered salvage or nonrepairable, and the appropriate box on page 1 must be selected.

Law enforcement agencies retaining ownership must:

- Write "No Sale For Law Enforcement Agency Use" in the "Purchaser Information" section, and
- Check the applicable box in the "Seller Certification" section.

Instructions to Purchaser

This form, when properly completed by the municipal, county, or sheriff's designee, is acceptable as valid evidence of ownership in lieu of a certificate of title for the vehicle described on page 1.

- The purchaser must submit an *Application for Texas Title and/or Registration* (Form 130-U) in their name, supported by this document, with a county tax assessor-collector.
- A Vehicle Inspection Report issued by a Texas Department of Public Safety certified safety inspection station is required if the vehicle was last titled or registered out-of-state.
- A certified weight certificate is required to support an application for title for a commercial vehicle.
- If vehicle is purchased by a licensed Texas dealer, the *Dealer's Reassignment of Title for a Motor Vehicle* (Form VTR-41-A) may be used to transfer the vehicle to a subsequent purchaser.
- If transferred to a demolisher, this form must be listed on the demolisher's inventory sheet and surrendered to the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles in lieu of the certificate of title under the provisions of Transportation Code, Sec. 683.056 and Sec. 683.057.
